If we're lucky, hindsight and contemplation come together and generate clarity for how we'd like to move forward and what that might look like.

Building on the success of *Crossroads: Change in Rural America* in 2023, our partners at the Great Falls Discovery Center, RiverCulture, and the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association, will join the libraries in exploring the cultural, industrial, and agricultural histories and futures of Franklin County with a new series of programs and exhibits, titled *Food, Farms, and Factories*. We'll kick off the series in January with a Sunday matinee documentary series, featuring the films *A Long Row in Fertile Ground, The Genesis of the Turners Falls Community*, and *The Franklin County Fair*. If you prefer to do your learning outdoors, join us on Saturday, January 20th at the Montague Center Library for an ecology walk that will illuminate the history of human habitation and innovation along the Sawmill River as well as the flora and fauna that make their homes there.
